# **GET TO KNOW YOUR DIRECTOR**



#### Tell me a little about your background.

I have been married to Richard for 43 years. We have two children, one son-inlaw, and two grandchildren. We were dairy farmers for 42 years and currently raise beefers and cash crop. I also work for Mary Kolodziej, CPA. I enjoy my granddaughters' sporting events, reading, gardening, cross-stitching, and walking. #### What are your experiences outside the co-op?

These two associations provide legislative and regulatory advocacy, education and training for cooperative employees and directors, and numerous youth leadership programs. #### Tell me a little about your history with CWEC.

I was secretary/treasurer for seven years. I have served on the Policy, Education, Building, and Finance committees. #### What do you see as a challenge(s) facing CWEC in the future?

I think our greatest challenge is to be proactive leaders as we see the power supply landscape changing. We need to balance integrating renewables into the portfolio while maintaining affordable rates.

#### What is your favorite memory as a director?

I have so many great memories. I am a strong believer in the cooperative business model. I enjoy meeting with fellow member—owners at CWEC events, such as the annual meeting and member Appreciation Pancake Breakfast. I also enjoy meeting with legislators in Madison and Washington, D.C., to talk about co-op issues.
